### HPV VACCINE

### SCREENING

Get regular  
HPV/Pap test to  
screen for  
cervical cancer  
beginning at  
age 21

### FOLLOW-UP/ TREATMENT

If your HPV/Pap  
test is abnormal,  
go back to your  
doctor/health  
care provider for  
a follow-up  
appointment

## What Can I Do To Wipe Out Cervical Cancer In Alabama?



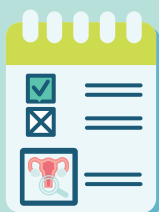
Watch the 35-minute video "**Conquering Cancer in Alabama**"

**Provide** employees with **educational materials** monthly or quarterly via email or mail\*



Collaborate with a local clinic to schedule a mobile **cervical cancer screening unit on-site** to facilitate cervical cancer screening

Engage **Human Resources** or your **Administrative Unit** and commit to informing employees that cervical cancer can be eliminated in our lifetime

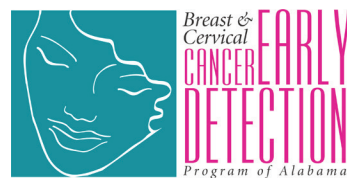


Consider adding information on **Cervical Cancer and HPV** in the **New Hire Packet**

Consider hosting a **health fair or lunch and learn** and invite a health care professional to provide education and answer questions about HPV vaccination, screening, and follow-up



If your business does not offer health insurance, share information about the **Alabama Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (ABC)** which provides free cervical cancer screening, follow-up tests, and cancer treatment for women with no health insurance **(1-877-252-3324)**



**Display educational flyers** on the company's website and bulletin boards, in restroom facilities and breakrooms, as well as other appropriate locations



**Consider** offering **paid time off** for employees to get screened for cervical cancer
