- The *HPV Communication Skills Training* proved effective at increasing HPV vaccination in a recent National Institutes of Health (NIH) funded study led by the University of California Los Angeles, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, and AAP PROS.
- Each module takes approximately 45 minutes to complete.

Who can benefit from taking these training modules?

These modules are intended for physicians (pediatricians, family medicine doctors), dentists, dental hygienists, dental assistants, pharmacists, Physician Assistants/Associates, Nurse Practitioners, Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, Medical Assistants, office staff, health educators, and community health workers.

What's in it for you?

In addition to learning evidence-based strategies to use when talking about the HPV vaccine, those who complete the training are eligible to receive up to 3.0 CE or CME credits.
