It takes 3 steps:



HPV VACCINE

Give the HPV vaccination to children and young adults aged 9-26





SCREENING

Get regular
HPV/Pap test to
screen for
cervical cancer
beginning at
age 21





FOLLOW-UP/ TREATMENT

If your HPV/Pap test is abnormal, go back to your doctor/health care provider for a follow-up appointment

What Can I Do To Wipe Out Cervical Cancer In Alabama?

Partner with local businesses, non-profit organizations, health care providers, and community opinion leaders to organize, develop, and host cervical cancer awareness events or activities (videos and slide decks available)



- Utilize firefighter demonstrations to show the importance and urgency of HPV vaccination, cervical cancer screening, and follow-up
- Distribute
 educational
 and
 promotional
 materials
 throughout
 the firehouse,
 auxiliary
 services, and
 community
- Organize and designate a
 WIPE OUT day for firefighters to wear
 WIPE OUT merchandise (t-shirts, stickers, logo, etc.)

Sponsor initiatives to engage the community in efforts to increase HPV vaccination, cervical cancer screening, and appropriate follow-up



Display educational

flyers on your organization's website and bulletin boards; Distribute HPV and cervical cancer



Share information about the Alabama Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (ABC) for free cervical cancer screenings, diagnostic testing, and cancer treatment for women who have no health insurance (1-877-252-3324)



Encourage moms, dads, and legal guardians to talk to their doctor about their children (boys and girls aged 9 - 18) getting the HPV vaccination. If they do not have health insurance, Vaccines for Children (VFC) provides free HPV vaccine
