








# LET'S COLOR

HPV, or Human Papillomavirus, is the main cause of cervical cancer as well as five other cancers.


But we can protect ourselves from this villain!





## LET'S COLOR

We can protect ourselves from getting the HPV virus by getting the HPV vaccine.

See below how many doses of the vaccine you need depending on your age.









#### **CHILDREN**

Between 9 and 12 years of age 2 Doses



#### **ADOLESCENTS**

Between 13 and 14 years of age 2 Doses



#### ADOLESCENTS AND ADULTS

Between 15 and 26 years of age 3 Doses

Talk to your parents or health care providers or get more information through reliable websites such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

## HPV VACCINE

The HPV vaccine is safe, effective, and has no long-term side effects



#### **FULL DOSE**

The HPV vaccine offers the best protection to boys and girls who complete all the recommended HPV vaccination doses.



#### **EFFECTIVE**

Studies have shown that this vaccine provides almost 100% protection against the types of HPV it targets.



#### SAFE

The HPV vaccine underwent years of extensive safety testing before being licensed by the FDA.



#### SIDE EFFECTS

Side effects are the ones common to most injectable vaccines: sore arm or itching at the site of injection, headache, high temperature, chills, feeling sick (nausea).



#### **NO COST**

It is covered by most health insurance plans. The Vaccines for Children (VFC) program provides vaccines for children 18 years of age & younger who are eligible.

# DON'T DELAY! SCREEN TODAY!



Every woman **between the ages of 21 and 65** should get screened for cervical cancer.


Screening can find changes **BEFORE** it turns into cancer, which means that it can **PREVENT** cervical cancer.

Talk to the women you love and tell them to go to the doctor and get screened.

If the doctor asks them to come back, make sure they go.



If they do not have health insurance, they can get screened for free through the Alabama Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program.


