# It takes 3 steps:



#### HPV VACCINE

Give the HPV vaccination to children and young adults aged 9-26





#### **SCREENING**

Get regular
HPV/Pap test to
screen for
cervical cancer
beginning at
age 21





#### FOLLOW-UP/ TREATMENT

If your HPV/Pap test is abnormal, go back to your doctor/health care provider for a follow-up appointment

## What Can I Do To Wipe Out Cervical Cancer In Alabama?

View the WIPE OUT Regional Meeting for your area and receive CME credit\*

Address known barriers to cervical cancer prevention and screening

- Establish a trusting relationship with your female patients
- Educate female patients about the HPV virus being the leading cause of cervical cancer
- Schedule the screening right away, before the patient departs from the office
- Explain what the screening consists of and next steps, particularly in the event of abnormal results

Ensure your female patients aged 21 - 64 are screened for cervical cancer regularly via the HPV/Pap test



**Utilize an EHR or other alert system** to identify patients who are due for screening

If you don't provide cervical cancer screening in your practice, once approved, consider recommending and offering self-collection for HPV testing

As a nurse practitioner **consider becoming a colposcopist**. The tools used in mobile colposcopy are easy to transport. Adherence to colposcopy appointments has increased drastically in the local health departments in Alabama with the utilization of mobile colposcopists

Use the **ASCCP** app on your phone to determine appropriate follow-up based on test results and family history

- The ASCCP app is \$9.99 for a lifetime subscription
- The ASCCP app can be found in the Apple/Android store under ASCCP Management Guidelines (ASCCP: American Society for Colposcopy and Cervical Pathology)

Consider contracting with the Alabama Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (ABC). For women with no health insurance, this program reimburses physicians at the Medicare rate for cervical cancer screening, and, if needed, diagnostic testing at no charge to the patient. The program also provides free treatment through Medicaid (1-877-252-3324)



Carefully explain abnormal results in detail to ensure understanding of importance of follow-up

Encourage moms, dads, and legal guardians to talk to their doctor about their children (boys and girls aged 9 - 18) getting the HPV vaccination. If they do not have health insurance, Vaccines for Children (VFC) provides free HPV vaccine for children and adolescents 9 - 18 years of age

**Display educational flyers** on bulletin boards, in restroom facilities, breakrooms, and other appropriate locations\*\*

Encourage your staff to educate, inform, and engage with patients regarding inquiries and concerns about screening and HPV vaccination

Use your **credibility** as a physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner to **spread** the word in your office and community
