

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO ELIMINATE CERVICAL CANCER IN ALABAMA?

It takes 3 steps:



HPV VACCINE

Give the HPV vaccination to children and young adults aged 9-26





SCREENING

Get regular
HPV/Pap test to
screen for
cervical cancer
beginning at
age 21





FOLLOW-UP/ TREATMENT

If your HPV/Pap test is abnormal, go back to your doctor/health care provider for a follow-up appointment

What Can I Do To Wipe Out Cervical Cancer In Alabama?

Display educational flyers on websites and bulletin boards, in restroom facilities, breakrooms, and other appropriate locations;

Distribute HPV vaccination materials to patients and families*

Share information about the Alabama Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (ABC) which offers free cervical cancer screening, diagnostic testing, and cancer treatment for women who have no health insurance (1-877-252-3324)



Encourage moms, dads, and legal guardians to talk to their doctor about their children (boys and girls aged 9 - 18) getting the HPV vaccination. If they do not have health insurance, Vaccines for Children (VFC) provides free HPV vaccine for children and adolescents 9 - 18 years of age



Encourage your colleagues to educate, inform, and engage with women regarding inquiries and concerns about HPV vaccination, cervical cancer screening, and appropriate follow-up

Use your **credibility** as a public health professional to **spread** the word

become an advocate
