

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO ELIMINATE CERVICAL CANCER IN ALABAMA?

It takes 3 steps:



HPV VACCINE

Give the HPV vaccination to children and young adults aged 9-26





SCREENING

Get regular
HPV/Pap test to
screen for
cervical cancer
beginning at
age 21





FOLLOW-UP/ TREATMENT

If your HPV/Pap test is abnormal, go back to your doctor/health care provider for a follow-up appointment

What Can I Do To Wipe Out Cervical Cancer In Alabama?

Include cervical cancer elimination in your club's Strategic Plan



Watch the 35-minute "Conquering Cancer in Alabama" in one of your weekly meetings and consider hosting a viewing of the video in your community

Reach out to other clubs for collaborations on implementation of HPV vaccination and cervical cancer screening programs in your community

Partner with local businesses, non-profit organizations, health care providers, and community opinion leaders to organize, develop, and host cervical cancer awareness events or activities (videos and slide decks available) Partner with school systems to work with students in promoting cervical cancer education – materials and examples can be found at the link below *

Sponsor grants or initiatives to engage the community in efforts to increase HPV vaccination, screening, and appropriate follow-up

Share information about the Alabama Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (ABC) for free cervical cancer screenings, diagnostic testing, and cancer treatment for women who have no health insurance (1-877-252-3324)



Encourage moms, dads, and legal quardians to talk to their doctor about their children (boys and girls aged 9 - 18) getting the HPV vaccination. If they do not have health insurance, Vaccines for Children (VFC) provides free HPV vaccine to children and adolescents 9 - 18 years of age

Encourage Rotarians in your club to consider paid time off for their employees to get screened for cervical cancer and get their children vaccinated
