WIPE OUT CERVICAL CANCER IN 3 STEPS



GET THE HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS (HPV) VACCINATIONS -

It is a powerful tool that prevents cervical cancer. The vaccine protects girls AND boys from the HPV virus which causes cervical cancer. The first dose is recommended at 9 years old, before they are exposed to the virus.

GET SCREENED FOR CERVICAL CANCER -

Women aged 21-65 should get a HPV/ PAP test regularly. When pre-cancer or cancer is found early it is more treatable.





BE SURE TO FOLLOW-UP WITH ANY ABNORMAL RESULTS -

The follow-up visit is very important, not going back to the doctor can lead to death.

DID YOU KNOW?

Alabama ranks 4th in the nation for people diagnosed and dying from cervical cancer which is a cancer that can be prevented. Over 90 percent of all cervical cancers are caused by HPV. You may qualify for free screenings which include a pelvic exam, HPV/PAP test, and diagnostic services such as a colposcopy, or biopsy, if needed.
